

# State of New-Jersey.

An act for dividing the township of Windsor in the county of Middlesex, into two separate townships.

Whereas it hath been represented to the Legislature by the Petition of sundry Inhabitants of the townships of Windsor in the county of Middlesex, that it would con-  
greatly promote the conveni-  
ence of the inhabitants of the  
said township, to have the same  
divided into two separate town-  
ships;

I Be it therefore enacted by  
the Council and General Assem-  
bly of this State; and it is hereby  
enacted by the authority of the  
same, That all that part of the  
said township of Windsor lying  
to the eastward of the following  
line, to wit, Beginning at Mill-  
stone creek in the line separating  
the lands of William Dook from  
lands of Iscarrick Moore, run-  
ning thence along said Iscarrick

Moore's line until it strikes the westwardly line of lands, late the property of William Smith, deceased, thence along said last mentioned line, to the easterly line of Lyell's Land; thence along said Lyell's easterly line, until it strikes Assanpink creek, thence down Assanpink creek to Augustin Gordon's line; thence along said Gordon's line to the Province line commonly called Keith's line, shall be, and the same is hereby set off from the said township, and established a separate township to be called and known by the name of East Windsor; and that all that part of the said township of Windsor lying to the westward of the aforesaid line, shall be and the same is hereby established a separate township to be called by the name of West Windsor.

II. And be it further enacted, that the Inhabitants of the said respective townships of East Windsor, and West Windsor, shall be, and they are hereby respectively vested with and entitled unto all the powers, priviledges, and authori-

rities, and subject to the like regulations and government, which the Inhabitants of the said township of Windsor before the passing of this act were, and which the Inhabitants of the other townships, wards and precincts of the said county of Middlesex, now are subject and entitled unto.

III And be it further enacted, that the Inhabitants of the said townships of East Windsor and West Windsor respectively shall meet at Haights town in the said township of East Windsor, and at the house where Jacob Bergen now lives, in the said township of West Windsor, on the day appointed by law for the first annual town meetings, after the passing of this act, and shall then and there proceed to the election of town officers for each of the said townships, in all respects conformably to the directions of an act of the Legislature, entitled "An Act for regulating the Election of Town Officers," passed at Burlington the nineteenth day of November in the year of our Lord, seventeen

hundred

hundred and ninety, and that until such elections shall be had and held as aforesaid, the several town Officers of the said townships of Windsor, elected for the present year, shall continue to exercise their several and respective Offices, and to perform and discharge their several and respective duties, within the limits of the said townships of East and West Windsor, in the same manner in all respects as before the passing of this act.

IV. And be it further enacted that at the next annual town meeting in the said townships of East Windsor and West Windsor, and at each and every succeeding annual town meeting in the townships aforesaid, there shall be elected by the Inhabitants thereof respectively two discreet and reputable persons in each of the said townships, being Freeholders in the township for which they shall respectively be elected; who, together with one or more of the Justices of the peace in and for the said county of Middlesex, and the two chosen Freeholders to be elected in each of the said

townships

townships pursuant to the directions  
of the said recited act of the legislature,  
shall constitute a board, to be called  
the town committee of the said  
townships of East and West Windsor  
respectively, for the purpose of inspect-  
ing and passing the accounts of the  
said townships, of making such  
orders and regulations for the  
better support of the poor of each of  
the said respective townships  
as may be expedient, and for trans-  
acting all such business of the  
said townships as is not special-  
ly entrusted to other officers thereof.

V. And be it further enacted by  
the authority aforesaid, that on  
the second Tuesday after the next  
annual town meeting in the said  
townships, the said Town Com-  
mittee of the said Townships of  
East and West Windsor shall meet  
at the place where the last an-  
nual town meeting for the town-  
ships of Windsor was held, at  
two o'clock in the afternoon of the  
said day, and then and there  
proceed to make an allotment  
between the said two townships  
of such poor persons as are now  
chargeable upon the township

of

of Windsor in such manner as that  
each of the said townships of East  
Windsor and West Windsor, shall  
and may contribute to the support  
of such poor persons in proportion  
to the taxable property contained  
within their respective limits; Pro-  
vided that if either of the Committees  
chosen as aforesaid shall neglect or re-  
fuse to meet as aforesaid, it shall and  
may be lawful for such Committee  
as shall meet, to proceed to such dis-  
tribution of the poor and such other  
business as is by this act directed  
and intended to be done.

VI. And be it further enacted,  
That all the Taxes heretofore assessed  
upon the said Township of Windsor  
by virtue of former laws of this State,  
shall be levied, collected and paid as in  
and by the said laws hath been declared  
and enacted, anything in this act  
to the contrary notwithstanding.
